

## 5 Moments for Hand Hygiene

## **Before**







**AFTER** body fluid exposure risk

**BEFORE** patient contact







AFTER

**BEFORE** aseptic task on the patient









AFTER contact with patient surroundings

## Good to know:

- Different nursing activities require several hand disinfections.
- 2. Disinfecting the hands prior to aseptic tasks is particular important to prevent healthcare associated infections.
- Gloves are a must when handling potentially infectious material, but are not a hundred per cent protection against infection: Always disinfect your hands after glove removal!
- 4 Hands need to be disinfected after touching a patient and before touching objects that are not in the patient's surroundings, e.g. ward trolleys!
- Hands need to be disinfected even when objects in the patient's surroundings are touched only, e.g. when exchanging glasses and water bottles on the bedside table!
